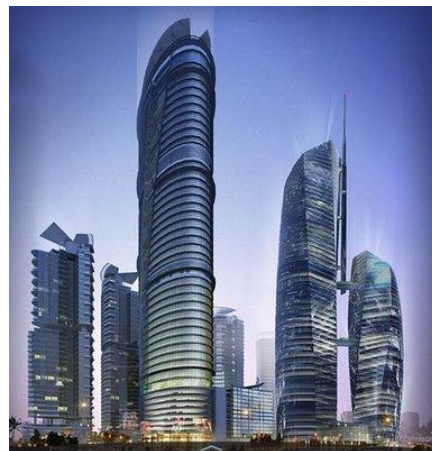
RSP Architects Sdn. Bhd. (2002-2004) , (2008-2014)

Plaza Sentral, Kuala Lumpur



- Consists of Phase 1 (3 blocks) and Phase 2 (4 blocks) of premier office suites.
- Conceived as a business hub without borders, with many world class multinationals as tenants.

Platinum Park, Kuala Lumpur



- One of the largest and unique integrated developments in Kuala Lumpur city centre.
- Encompasses a magnificent ring of six towering skyscrapers conceived with utmost attention, soaring with pride over 9.1 acres of freehold land.
- Home to high-grade offices, upscale retail region, 6-star hotel with full-service apartments and luxury residences.
- The amalgamation of these components brings together a complete, self-sufficient development with the capability to sustain aspects of work, leisure and living seamlessly in one prominent address.
- The Residences, two high-rise structures, comprised of 912 residential units in total, will be the next phase of Platinum Park to be launch.

Angkasa raya Tower, Kuala Lumpur



- Stand as a symbol of Malaysia's diverse and multi-cultural society.
- It connects to the city by inviting life into its balancing heights and visually projecting it back into the urban landscape.
- The new tower will stand directly across the Petronas, offering new architectural qualities to the vibrancy of the city's inner core.
- Angkasa Raya is made up of three cubic volumes which appear to float above open, horizontal layers.
- The "ground levels" form an interconnected spiral of both pedestrian and vehicular circulation and draw the diversity of the streetscape into the building.
- A multitude of public spaces and activities including shops, a food court, car parks, terraces and prayer rooms bring urban life into the transparent stacks, while tropical nature invades and enlivens its multiple levels.

Queensbay Mall, Penang



- Queensbay Mall in Bayan Lepas is the largest and longest shopping mall on Penang Island.
- Built up area of 2.5 million sq ft, and a total net lettable area of 1 million sq ft.
- The 9-storey mall has 5 storeys of shopping space for 500 outlets, and 8 storeys of parking space.

Kuala Lumpur Tower



- Located in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
- Completed on 1 March 1995.
- It is used for communication purposes and features an antenna that reaches 421 metres (1,381 feet).
- The roof of the pod is at 335 metres (1,099 feet).
- The rest of the tower below has a stairwell and an elevator to reach the upper area, which also contains a revolving restaurant, providing diners with a panoramic view of the city.

Petronas Twin Towers (at early planning stage with Cesar Pelli Architect)



- Known as the Petronas Twin Towers, twin skyscrapers in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.
- According to the Council on Tall Buildings and Urban Habitat (CTBUH)'s official definition and ranking, they were the tallest buildings in the world from 1998 to 2004 and remain the tallest twin towers in the world replacing World Trade Center in New York.
- Landmark of Kuala Lumpur, along with nearby Kuala Lumpur Tower.

Holiday Villa Hotel, Cherating



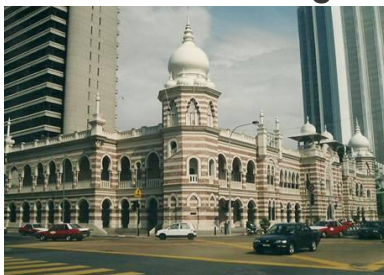
- Situated on one of Malaysia's finest beaches on the east coast of Peninsula Malaysia.

Bank Pembangunan Kuala Lumpur



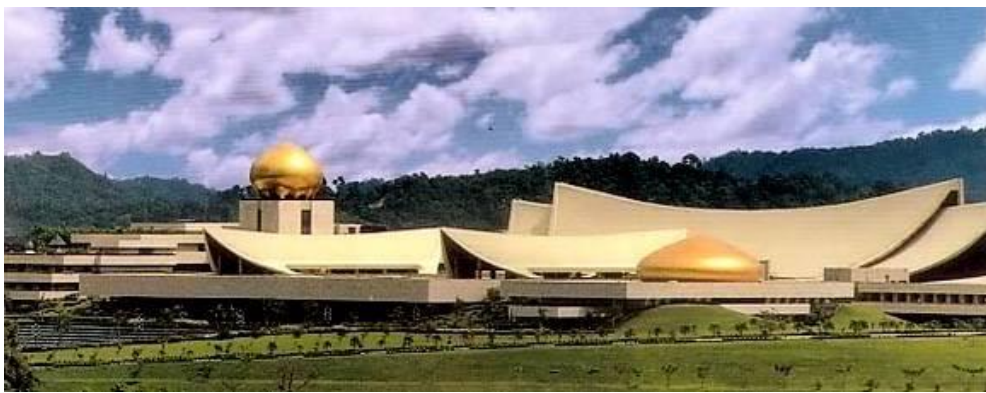
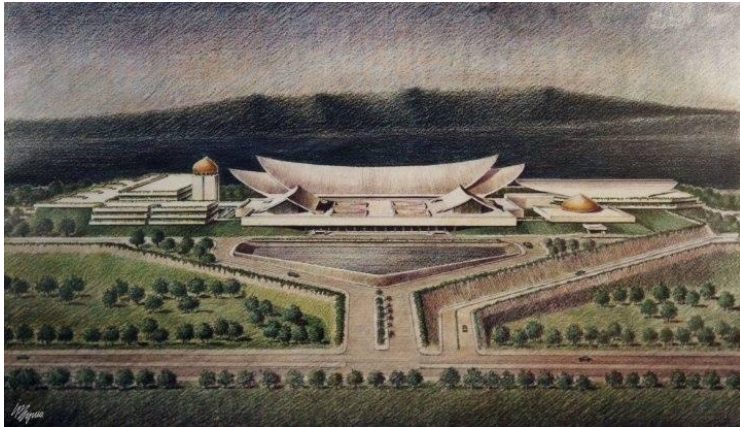
- Known as Malaysia Development Bank is a development financial institution (DFI) owned by the Malaysian Government through the Minister of Finance Inc.

Brunei Palace



- The name "Istana Nurul Iman" means *Palace of the Light of Faith*.
- Located on a leafy, riverside sprawl of hills on the banks of the Brunei River, a few kilometers south of Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei's capital.
- Official residence of the Sultan of Brunei, Hassanal Bolkiah, and the seat of the Brunei government.
- The palace contains 1,788 rooms, which includes 257 bathrooms, a banquet hall that can be expanded to accommodate up to 5,000 guests, a mosque accommodating 1,500 people.
- The palace also includes a 110-car garage, an air conditioned stable for the Sultan's 200 polo ponies, and 5 swimming pools.
- Contains 2,152,782 square feet (200,000 m²) of floorspace.
